

JANUARY, 1923.

On January 5th Masked Wood-Swallows (*Artamus personatus*) were about with young just out of the nest. Red-backed Grass-Parrots (*Psephotus haematonotus*) are still about, and appear to have again permanently settled in the district. They were observed feeding on the seeds of the wire-weed on 5th and 10th insts.

My best record for the month is a pair of Black-shouldered Kites (*Elanus axillaris*), which were flying about near Henley Beach. Apparently they were not new to the district, and probably nested somewhere near.

Southern Black-headed Miners, White-plumed Honey-eaters, Black-and-white Fantails, and Black-faced Cuckoo-Shrikes have been present all the month.
