While motoring towards Meningie on 10th February over a practically trackless and unfrequented part of the country about 10 miles east of the township, I noted during a very heavy downpour of rain an Emu-Wren (*Stipiturus malachurus*). It flew parallel with the car at a distance of five or six feet and at about the same speed as the car for eight or nine yards, and then dived into a small bush. The country was whitish sand with very low Mallee and bushes two to three feet high. On 24th February I saw a pair of Red Rosellas (*Platycercus eximius*) on Mount Osmond. They were feeding on the ground and flew into a large Gum, and had no doubt taken up their residence in the vicinity.
