The birds noted here during the month were—Spur-winged Plover, Musk Lorikeet, Purple-crowned Lorikeet, Crimson Rosella (*P. elegans*), Red-backed Parrot, Boobook Owl, Barn Owl, Laughing Jack, Narrow-billed Bronze Cuckoo, Welcome Swallow, Willie-Wagtail, Restless Flycatcher, Eastern Shrike-Tit (*P. frontatus*), Grey Shrike-Thrush, Black-faced Cuckoo-Shrike, Yellow-tailed Thornbill, Blue Wren, Magpie-Lark, Grey-backed Silvereye, Red-tipped Pardalote, White-naped Honey-eater, Black-chinned Honey-eater, Yellow-winged Honey-eater (*M. novae-hollandiae*), Noisy Miner, Red Wattle-Bird, White-backed Magpie. The Narrow-billed Bronze Cuckoo—the first Cuckoo to be noted here this season—was heard for the first and only time this month at 2.4 p.m. on 1st instant. Immediately it finished about five “seeee you” (which calls are given in succession with a very slight stoppage between them) some half-dozen Starlings (*S. vulgaris*) began calling “See you,” but their calls have longer intervals between them and can thus be distinguished from those of this Cuckoo. The Starlings continued to call for some time, and the Cuckoo did not appear to stay about here, as its call was not heard again.
