The birds noted during this month were almost similar to those given for June. The Musk Lorikeet, Barn Owl, and White-naped Honey-eater were not observed. A Brush Wattle-Bird was heard on 6th instant, and a Fantailed Cuckoo was heard, for the first and only time this month, at 8.25 a.m. on 3rd instant. The Narrow-billed Bronze Cuckoo was heard only on 27th instant, at 8 a.m. Stone Plovers were heard about 5.30 a.m. on 20th and 27th instants, but whether they are wild birds or birds in captivity I have not as yet been able to decide. A male Scarlet Robin was seen on 24th instant.
