

—August, 1924.—

10th instant.—At Meadows a nest of the Brown Thornbill (*Acanthiza pusilla*) was found with three eggs in it. A Scarlet Robin (*Petroica multicolor*) was building a nest. At Chambers's Hill a Spotted Ground-Bird (*Cinlosoma punctatum*) was feeding close to the road and took little notice of the motor-car and slowly walked away.

17th instant.—At Mannum a nest of the Noisy Miner (*Myzantha garrula*) was found, and a Willie-Wagtail (*Rhipidura leucophrys*), and a Magpie-Lark (*Grallina cyanoleuca*) were building nests, Red-backed Parrots (*Psephotus haematonotus*) were in pairs and examining hollows in the trees. A Blue-faced Honey-eater (*Pentomyzon cyanotis*) was noted in the gums along the Murray River.

23rd instant.—Near Happy Valley an Owlet Nightjar (*Aegotheles cristata*) was flushed from a hollow in a tree:

24th instant.—At Harrowgate two flocks (40 and 30 each) of the White or Sulphur-crested Cockatoo (*Cacatua galerita*) were seen.
