. 6th September, near Happy Valley.—Owlet Nightjar
(*Aegotheles cristata*) flushed from the same hollows as on 23rd

ultimo. Black-chinned Honey-eater (*Melithreptus gularis*)—Bird was seen feeding young. Yellow-winged Honey-eater (*Meliorhis novae-hollandiae*)—Two nests were found with three eggs in each. Brush Wattle-Bird (*Creadion chrysoptera*)—A nest was found with two fresh eggs. Purple-crowned Lorikeet (*Glossopsitta porphyrocephala*)—A nest in a hollow with three eggs. Tree-Martins (*Hylochelidon nigricans*) were carrying nesting material.

14th September.—Fairy Martins (*Hylochelidon ariel*) were flying about at Tungkillo, Palmer, and Mannum. At Mannum, Blue-faced Honey-eater (*Entomyzon cyanotis*) noticed feeding young. Noisy Miner (*Myzantha garrula*)—Three nests were noticed. Red-backed Parrots (*Psephotus haematonotus*) were noted cleaning out hollows.
