*Podargus strigoides*—Nest 13 feet from the ground, almost over the gate, on a horizontal bough of a tree. Female sitting on eggs. Male bird roosts in a tree 50 yards away. He never seems to stay in the same tree as the female.

*Pardalotus xanthopygius*—Saw birds collecting coconut fibre a week ago (Monday, 6th). The male went into a hole in the ground, then the female for 1½ minutes, without anything; then she went in again.

*Zanthoniza phrygia*—Young ones not so coloured as parents; tails the proper colour, very buffish tinge underneath.
