

Birds seen at Wilgena Station, near Tarcoola,
November, 1925.

During a motor drive of about 60 miles (to 30 miles north) at Wilgena Station on 25th November, the following were noted:—*Ocyphaps lophotes*, 8; *Uroaetus audax*, 2; *Haliastur sphenurus*, 1; Large Hawk, 1; *Cerchneis cenchroides*, 1; *Cacatua roseicapilla*, 6; *Psephotus varius*, 8; *Hirundo neoxena*, 1; *Petroica*, 2; *Rhipidura leucophrys*, 1; *Pomatostomus*, 2; *Epthianura tricolor*, 1; *Artamus*, 6; *Climacteris*, 1; *Meliphaga virescens*, 2; *Acanthagenys rufogularis*, 7; *Anthus australis*, 1; *Taeniopygia castanotis*, 240 (two flocks of 100 or more each); Crows, 199 (one flock of 110); *Gymnorhina*, apparently *G. hypoleuca*, 2; unidentified, 10. Also three birds were seen, either *Aphclocephala* or *Acanthiza uropygialis* (brown rump). A specimen of *Anthus* was shot: sex (?), iris very dark brown, bill brown and pallid below except at the tip, pharynx and gape yellowish, legs light fleshy brown, total length $6\frac{1}{4}$ inches, span of outspread wings $10\frac{1}{2}$ inches.
